In its second year, The Student Arts Expo highlights the arts by and for the youth of the community showcasing their works in a variety of venues throughout Downtown.



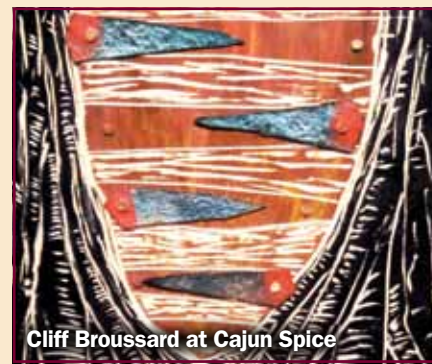
From 2 p.m.-8 p.m. on May 14, student art from those in the Lafayette Parish School System will be featured in businesses, hanging alongside professional talent in galleries and covering the sidewalks and

fences of Downtown parcs. The opening ceremonies kick off at 2p.m. in Parc Putnam

with performances by student musicians and the announcement of the winners of the student chalk art contest. Throughout the day, performance art from jazz music to spoken word poetry will be offered in Parc Sans Souci and Parc Putnam, and visual art can be found in businesses as visitors explore the district.

Through the expo, LPSS hopes to build strong advocates for all of the arts in public schools by educating the community of the academic value of the arts and the ways that students' creativity, critical thinking and fine arts skills are developed. "The Student Arts Expo is a celebration of what students have accomplished in and through the arts," said Sandy Labry, Lafayette Parish School System.

Students participating in this event will have the rare experience of exhibiting their creative works to the wider public. "This monumental effort by AcA's education team, showcases both visual and performing artists from all Lafayette Parish Schools, it is an opportunity for our youth to experience both the challenges and pride that comes with exhibiting their talents. This expo also serves as a true community builder, bringing together multiple generations and families from throughout Lafayette Parish," said Gerd Wuestemann, Executive Director for the Acadiana Center for the Arts.

Gallery Highlights

In May, the galleries in the Downtown Lafayette Cultural District highlight celebrated local and regional artists. At Galerie Eclairouse, Melissa Bonin showcases her personal, poetic and symbolic interpretation of the native landscape resulting in works possessing a unique language of color, light and spatial relationships. Sans Souci Fine Crafts Gallery features artisan, Valerie Milner Graham, with her fine crafted gourd masks and

gourd vessels. Cliff Broussard's current works at Cajun Spice are ceramic/metal pieces incorporating elements of drawing, enameling, printmaking and painting. Shapes, patterns, lines and colors gleaned from Cliff's personal observations of south Louisiana are fused into clay, wood and metal. In addition to works by students from Carencro High School, Gallery 549 features Frederic O. Daspit with an exhibition of his recent sculptures drawing inspiration from Near-Eastern palaces and the ruins of ancient Aztec, Mayan and Incan civilizations.

During ArtWalk, the Acadiana Center for the Arts will unveil Southern Open, which is a competitive juried exhibition featuring artists from the five southern states of Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Florida.

The Main Library at 301 West Congress will remain closed for at least two years for a major renovation. Renovations will begin at the Main Library once the facility is completely vacated later this year. The library's hours of service will be Monday – Thursday 8:30 a.m.-6:30 p.m.; Friday 8:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m.; Saturday 10:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.; and Sunday 1:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m. The library will also open Galerie Lafayette for 2nd Saturday ArtWalk featuring artist exhibitions every month. In addition to the entrance on Jefferson Street, library patrons can also enter from the Buchanan Street side, and parking is available in the lot across from that entry way. Buchanan Lofts Ribbon Cutting

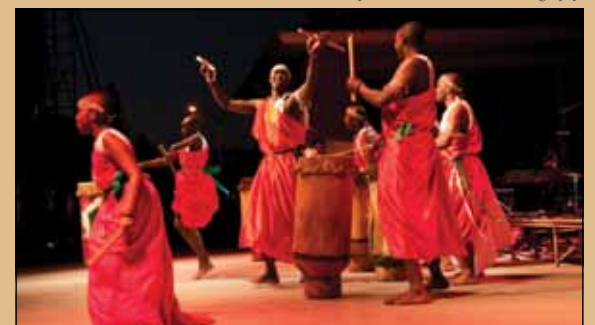
