



The LAFAYETTE sign was crowd-funded with the intent of being an interactive public art installation that allows not-for-profit entities to paint its letters to promote community events and awareness. The guidelines for painting it include:

1. The proposed concept for painting the sign must be submitted to LCG, Kate Durio, kdurio@lafayettela.gov prior to painting.
 2. The timing of the painting must be coordinated with LCG, Kate Durio, kdurio@lafayettela.gov prior to painting.
 3. When painting the letters, all parc guidelines must be followed.

 4. No logos or commercial marks are permitted on the YLAFAYETTE sign.
 5. If the painting of the letters is intended to be held in conjunction with an event, an application for the event must be submitted. See <http://www.downtownlafayette.org/events/parc-rentals.html> to determine if a lease, insurance and permit requirements are necessary. Please note, the parcs are only leasable to non-profits and weddings at least 30 days in advance of the event.
 6. No paint or supplies are provided, and organizers are responsible for all cleanup and damages to the parc or sign. It is a good idea to start painting at the top of the letters and work your way down. It takes 2 or 3 people about 3 to 4 hours to paint them completely. Here's what you'd need to paint one solid color (all approximate):
 - Damp towels to clean letters before painting
 - 2-3 gallons of exterior GRAY primer
 - 2-3 gallons of one solid color, matte, exterior paint
 - Rollers for surfaces of the letters
 - 1.5-2" sponge brushes for interior and corners of letters
 - Tarp to cover the ground (required for complete coverage of the metal Y marker to avoid paint splatters on the metal disc)
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
